

How High Plains Shield Takes a Plot

A dated, sealed observation so “this asset, this date” is defensible — without inventing a national fuel-measurement standard

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Executive Summary

“We walked the site” is not a defensible fuel claim. Under wildfire mitigation plan (WMP) review, insurance underwriting, and discovery scrutiny, vague location language — “near mile 14,” “around the pad,” “in the ROW” — collapses because it cannot answer the only question that matters: **this asset, this date, this observation — can it be checked?**

A **plot**, as High Plains Shield, LLC uses the term publicly, is a **dated observation at a recorded coordinate, on a named asset, in a named treatment zone**. It records four physical states — **load · continuity · curing · dead-and-down** — and is bound by a **seal quartet**: photo · pin (coordinate) · time · observer. Edit any of those four and **independent check fails**.

Plot sampling itself is **not** an HPS invention. Brown’s planar intercept, FSveg, FuelCalc, and agency field guides already exist. The public gap this essay addresses is not inventing a national fuel-measurement standard; it is making **asset-and-date attachment** checkable so measured claims survive audit.

Where it stands: Pad / yard / battery → named site + named treatment zones (Zone 1–3 shorthand OK; Zone 1 never empty if that site was walked). Line / ROW → structure-id + span-id + date (“near mile 14” is a **note**, not a plot).

Two clocks stay two. Fuel-as-of = the walk. Conditions-as-of = the named weather case if fire behavior is computed. Heat is **not** a third clock and is **not** written as fuel. **Empty ground:** if a zone/span was in the job but not walked → **modeled-and-labeled** (layer + vintage named); never blended with a neighbor and sold as measured.

Vague location	“Near mile 14,” “around the battery,” “in the corridor”	Cannot bind observation to a named asset geometry
Undated observation	Photos and notes without a checkable as-of	Cannot defend <i>when</i> the fuel state was claimed
Unsealed / editable record	Spreadsheets and PDFs rewriteable after the walk	Independent check cannot detect post-hoc change

Claim (problem thesis): High-consequence forums do not need another national fuel-sampling invention. They need **dated, attributable, asset-attached observations** whose integrity can be independently checked — so that “measured” means something under WMP, underwriting, and discovery.

***Illustration (non-normative):** An underwriter receives a site walk PDF with photographs labeled “ROW fuel — mile 14 vicinity.” Counsel later asks: Which structure? Which span? What coordinate? What date? Who observed? Did any of those change after capture? Without plot-grade attachment and a seal quartet, the packet is a narrative, not an auditable observation.*

Plot sampling methods already exist (Brown’s planar intercept; FSveg; FuelCalc; agency guides). **Claim:** The public gap is not method novelty — it is **defensible attachment of “this asset, this date.”** Inventing a national fuel-measurement standard is explicitly **out of scope**.

2. Framework — Plot Definition, States, Seal, Attachment, Clocks

2.1 Plot definition

A **plot** is a dated observation at a recorded coordinate, on a **named asset**, in a **named treatment zone** (or named span attachment for linear assets).

Element	Public meaning
Dated	Observation carries an as-of time that travels with the record
Recorded coordinate	Pin / location sufficient for independent spatial check
Named asset	Operational object (site, structure, facility) identified — not free-text vicinity
Named treatment zone / span	Local management geometry the observation attaches to

Claim: Without all four elements, “we walked it” remains a story. With them, the observation becomes a candidate for sealed, checkable evidence.

2.2 Four physical states

The plot writes four physical states. These are **observation classes**, not a fire-behavior model and not a scoring recipe:

State	Public meaning (role language)
Load	How much fuel mass / volume class is present at the observation
Continuity	How connected the fuel is horizontally / vertically for spread pathways
Curing	Live-to-dead / curing condition of vegetation relevant to ignitability
Dead-and-down	Surface dead-and-down woody contribution at the observation

Illustration (non-normative): Two pads can share a similar load class and still differ sharply on continuity or curing. Recording only one state and calling the walk “complete” understates what a plot is for.

2.3 Seal quartet (photo · pin · time · observer)

Seal element	Role
Photo	Visual evidence bound to the observation event
Pin	Coordinate / location bound to the observation
Time	As-of timestamp of the observation
Observer	Attributable observer (or attributable role)

Claim: Edit any of the four and **independent check fails**. That is sealed-record language at public altitude — the same teach surface as PlotSeal “seal at capture” (HPS-09-ART-PS-02-PUB). This essay does **not** disclose vault architecture, verifier protocol internals, device-binding, or key management.

Naming lock: **PlotSeal** = registry / system of record (+ sealed provenance). Prefer **Wildfire System of Record** when SoR is mentioned. Do not use “Wildfire Data Center” as a public lead name.

2.4 Where it stands — pad vs line / ROW

Claim: The two clocks stay two. **Heat is not a third clock** and is **not written as fuel**. Conflating heat outputs, weather cases, and fuel observations is how packets lose defensibility under challenge. Cross-link (informative): Fuel Condition Time Series essay (HPS-09-ART-FCTS-01-PUB).

2.6 Empty ground — modeled-and-labeled, never blended as measured

If a zone or span was **in the job** but **not walked**:

- The fuel term is **modeled-and-labeled**.
- The **layer** is named.
- The **vintage** is named.
- It is **never** blended with a neighbor observation and sold as measured.

Claim: Empty ground honesty is a literacy requirement, not a marketing footnote. Cross-link: **MMG** (Measured / Modelled / Grounded); **GFMS-1.0** basis tags and support rules for normative interface language.

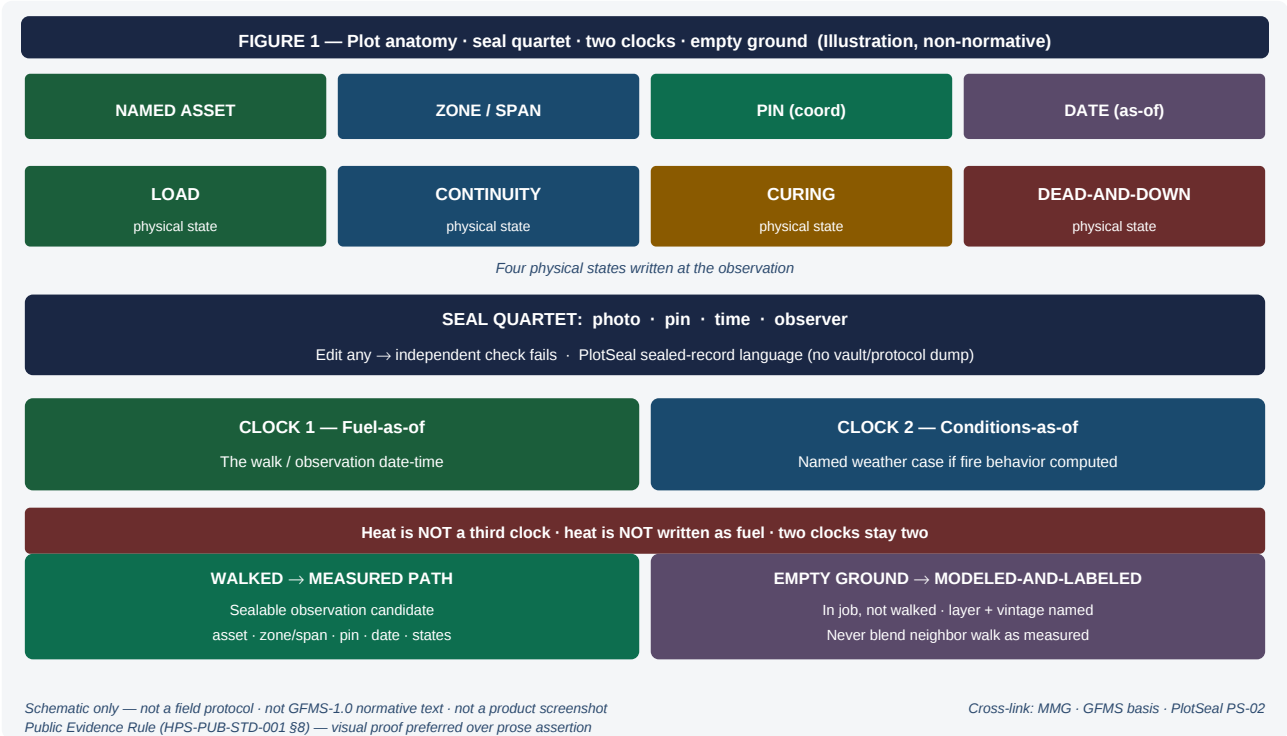


Figure 1 — Plot anatomy, seal quartet, two clocks, and empty-ground path. Schematic only; not a field protocol; not GFMS-1.0 normative text; not a product screenshot. Public Evidence Rule (HPS-PUB-STD-001 §8).
