How a sealed Ground Record operationalizes CFI — without confusing the product with the category or the open standard

Executive Summary

Buyers, dockets, and diligence teams often collapse four different things into one marketing phrase: the **category**, the **open standard**, the **registry / system of record**, and a **commercial vehicle**. When that collapse happens, “better fuel map” language fails wildfire mitigation plan (WMP) review, insurance underwriting, and litigation discovery — because none of those forums asks whether a layer looks sharper. They ask whether fuel evidence is physical, sealed, attributable, and independently checkable.

RiskWise is High Plains Shield, LLC’s **commercial vehicle** for operationalizing **Cryptographic Fuel Intelligence (CFI)**. It is taught here as a **physical field program**, a **sealed data pipeline**, and a **documented record-keeping system** — not merely a SaaS tile and not a satellite-map upgrade. The deliverable concept is the **RiskWise Ground Record**: sealed, attributable, GFMS-interchange-ready fuel evidence suitable for docket, underwriting, and discovery *conversations* (claim carefully; illustration vs absolute).

Public stack map (locked): CFI (category) → GFMS-1.0 (open interface) → PlotSeal (registry / SoR + sealed-provenance concept) → RiskWise (commercial vehicle). **GFHL** is the spatial expression that RiskWise or other conformant workflows may surface.

Claim (problem thesis): High-consequence buyers do not need another marketing synonym for fuel layers. They need a **named separation** of category, standard, registry, and commercial vehicle — so that “grounded” claims can be tested against public properties rather than vendor slogans.

***Illustration (non-normative):** An underwriter receives a high-resolution fuel grid and a polished PDF. Counsel later asks: Who measured this plot? Was it sealed at capture? Can we verify the sealed payload offline without the vendor? Is interchange open? A sharper satellite map does not answer those questions. Confusing RiskWise with CFI — or CFI with GFMS — makes the diligence conversation fail before evidence is even opened.*

What “better fuel map” marketing cannot survive: WMP docket questions about physical basis; underwriting questions about custody and seal time; discovery questions about whether the record changed after collection. Those forums price **provenance**, not palette.

2. Framework — RiskWise as Commercial Vehicle for CFI

2.1 What RiskWise is

RiskWise is High Plains Shield, LLC's **commercial vehicle** for operationalizing CFI-conformant workflows. Of-record public framing:

- A **physical field program** — plot-level human observation with calibrated instrument classes; remote sensing may inform, not replace, the sealed physical anchor.

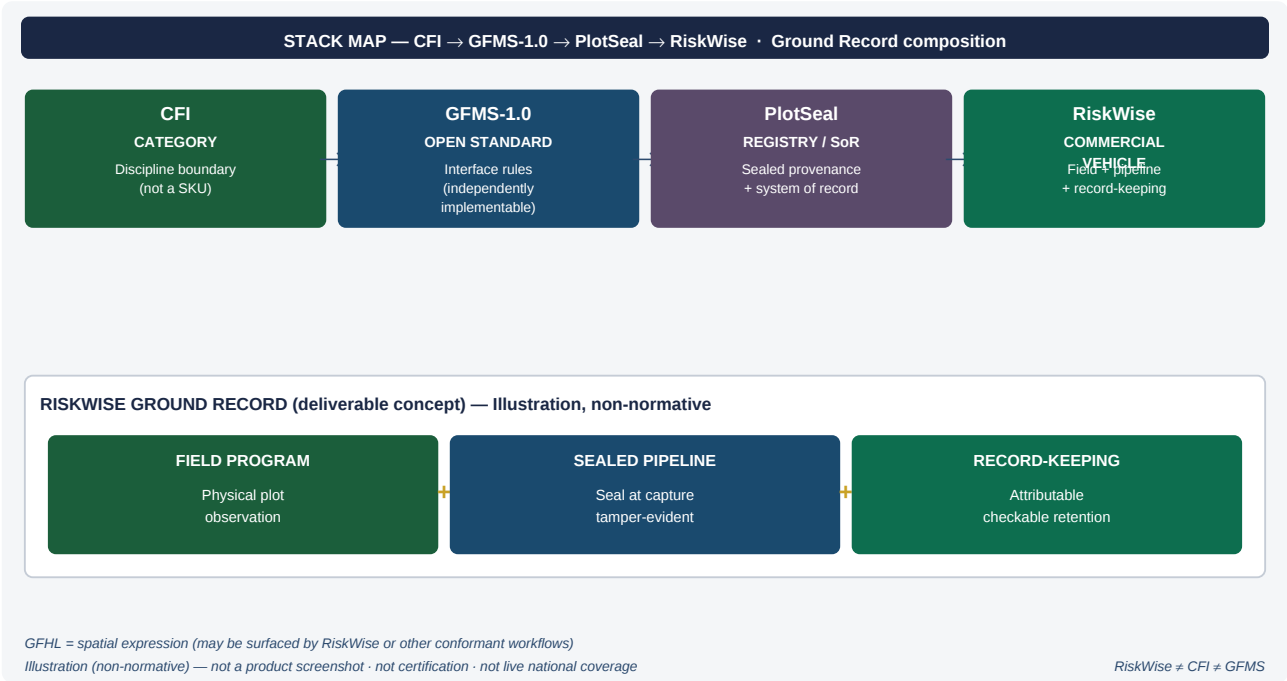

6. Ask of any “CFI product” pitch in your stack: *Is this naming the category, the standard, the registry, or a commercial vehicle — and can the sealed Ground Record properties be checked without collapsing those roles?*
